Memphis Botanic Garden Hosts New Pop-Up Spring Ephemerals and Woodland Wildflowers Sale this April

Memphis, TN – Memphis Botanic Garden (MBG) will host its inaugural Spring Ephemerals and Woodland Wildflowers Sale on April 1 from 9 am to 1 pm at its Nursery at the Garden. This special pop-up sale features a selection of spring ephemerals & woodland wildflowers for sale, most of which are native. These short-blooming botanicals offer a wonderful pop of color in the early spring landscape. Woodland favorites such as Phlox, Trillium, Foamflowers, Solomon’s Seal, Christmas Ferns, Sedges, and Bleeding Hearts, among many other selections will be available.

“Spring ephemerals are woodland plants that flower early in the spring to catch as much sunlight as possible before trees leaf out and then die back as the summer grows hotter. Most of us just know them as woodland wildflowers. Spring ephemerals are one of the best ways to extend your flower season and add some woodland magic to a shady spot in your landscape as well as providing much needed resources for pollinators as they wake up in early spring,” explains Daniel Grose, Director of Horticulture.

Expert horticultural staff will be on hand at the sale to answer any questions as well as help customers with suggestions about plantings in their own gardens and offer advice on plant care and maintenance. The Spring Ephemerals and Woodland Wildflowers Sale is open to the public.

The Garden will still host its annual Spring Plant Sale on April 13-15, which will feature thousands of plants curated for the sale including a great selection of natives, pollinator plants, trees, shrubs, vegetables, herbs, annual flowers, tropicals, houseplants, and more.
